My dear Rose

I hope you won't think me a nuisance but I wonder if you would do a kindness to a Newfoundland boy who has come to the Pavilion Hospital. He is Pte J. Wells No 1734, 1st Newfoundland Regt. - He came round to the Post Office about a letter & stayed to talk to him - He seemed very down in his luck said he hated Brighton etc. Then he informed me that the doctor wanted to operate on his leg, but he refused to consent, he had had six operations & wasn't going to have another - I called to him like a mother, but he was very determined - At last he ~~at last~~ departed but returned in about ten minutes to say he had thought it over & would have the operation - I believe the fact that I told him that the Governor of Newfoundland was a friend of mine lent weight to my advice! I saw him yesterday & again to-day he has

had the operation, but is rather miserable  
tho' certainly better to-day. I thought perhaps  
if you were to send him a picture paper or  
some cigarettes or indeed anything it might  
cheer him a little especially coming from  
the Governor's relations - He has a curious  
accent & I find him rather difficult to  
understand - I asked me to answer a letter  
for him & I find he cannot write & the  
other men tell me he cannot read either!  
I fancy there is some Association which  
looks after the Newfoundland Regt & sends  
them parcels - I tried to find one from  
him & understood that he had had  
parcels but not very lately. He asked me  
if I could ask them to send him some  
"Ornitho" Newfoundland Tobacco" - Do you  
know the address? Don't trouble about it  
if you don't as I daresay when he is better  
I can find <sup>see it</sup> ~~one~~ from him - I hope you  
won't think very cruel of me worrying you  
but I am sure you won't, you are too kind  
to mind - I feel so sorry for the boy, he is

quite young & seems so friendless - because  
so busy we have not much time to give to  
individuals beside which in our position we  
have to be a little careful & not make favors.  
we had a dreadful day down there to-day as  
the Board room chimney was swept, & all  
the soot came down into our little Post office  
we had to turn every thing on & see the  
whole place cleaned, as a result - I am  
somewhat exhausted & can't write straight  
so you must excuse mistakes.

Sir,-

I am directed by the Executive of this Association to bring to your attention the case of a disabled returned Veteran named Isaac Wells, who, as a consequence, of doing his 'bit' suffered the loss of a leg which was amputated close to the hip. This man's artificial leg became somewhat damaged and he made application to the Pension Commissioners to have same repaired. His request was granted, and as it necessitated his walking to the Hospital over heavy roads, he asked if a conveyance might be provided. Same, however, could not be granted as the Pension people claimed they had no authority to do this.

In our opinion it was a singular impossibility to have him walk <sup>THIS</sup> ~~such~~ a distance with such a disability, and we think it hardly humane that he should be expected to do so. We therefore think that the Pensions Dept., should arrange some mode of dealing with those cases and it is with this in view that we respectfully bring this to your notice.

I am also writing the Pension Commissioners in regard to this case.
