Dear Madam,

It was with the greatest regret that the Government received the cable from the Record Office, London, intimating that your brave son, Private Frederick Wheeler, had died of wounds on the 10th July at the 1st Stationary Hospital, Rouen.

Permit me to express on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy with you in this time of sorrow. The loss of our loved ones fills us with grief, but it may be some comfort to you to consider that your gallant boy responded so nobly to the call of King and Country and died gallantly fighting for the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. He has laid down the weapons of his earthly warfare but he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory and his name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow countrymen. We are proud of our gallant lads who so unselfishly and loyally came forward at the call of duty and we are equally proud of the fathers and mothers who gave their boys for the service of King and Empire. When the war is over and Peace and Righteousness again reign upon the earth, it will be your proud thought that this was brought about in some degree at least by the noble efforts of your dear boy.

I trust that you may have the comforting presence of the Great Father of us all at this time.

I write to ask if you will kindly inform the relatives of "the above named soldiers, now deceased, that the Grave Site of their "son has been put in splendid order during the past fortnight, also "that the flowers and foliage planted will stand the cold weather and "bloom again next year. There has also been placed on each of "these graves a nice artificial wreath of white roses with this "inscription "DERNIER DEVOIR", a token from some french society. "These are the only two of our brave fellows who have been buried in "this town and my only regret is that it is not possible for me to "visit other towns, such as Etretat, Havre, Boulogne, St. Pol. etc "so that all of their resting places might receive the same attention.

Grave Sites

Further to my No. 4385/185, 23/10/16, I have the honour to state that No. 109, O.R.S. H.C. Janes, whilst attached for duty at the Base, Rouen, took certain steps with regard to this subject, as reflected in the following extracts from his reports to me:

"Sir, Re Graves of Crosbie and Wheeler

I write to ask if you would kindly inform the relatives of the above named soldiers, now deceased, that the Grave Site of their son has been put in splendid order during the past fortnight, also, that the flowers and foliage planted will stand the cold weather and bloom again next year. There has also been placed on each of these graves a nice artificial wreath of white roses with this inscription "DERBIER DEVOIR", a token from some French society. These are the only two of our brave fellows who have been buried in this town and my only regret is that it is not possible for me to visit other towns, such as Etretat, Havre, Boulogne, St. Pol, etc., so that all of their resting places might receive the same attention. (D.R.M.E.)

The cemetery in which the two men in question are buried is known by the name of St. Sever Cemetery, Rouen, and up to the present it contains some 3000 British soldiers each of whom is allotted a separate grave-site. Also, there is a small wooden cross at the head of each bearing the soldier's Regt.No., Rank, Name and the name of his Regiment.

In a day or two I shall apply to the Graves Commissions and Enquiry Bureau, c/o British Consul, Rouen, to have the graves photographed for me and as soon as received I shall immediately forward the same to you for transmission to the relatives of these men.

Should there be any funds which may be used for this purpose, please credit my account with 40 (forty) francs being sum spent re above."

In preference to applying by letter to the Graves, Commissions & Enquiry Bureau for photographs of the graves of the late No. 1447, Pte. Crosbie, G. and

No. 1680, Pte. Wheeler, F., I made a personal visit to their Office and have received much valuable information.

All applications for photographs must be sent to the following address:- "Director of Graves, Registrations and Enquiries, War Office, Winchester House, St. James Square, London, S.W." Hence it seems to me that it is far advantageous that all applications for the photographs of the graves of our boys be made from your Offices. I have been given to understand that the two in question have already been photographed and consequently it is only the matter of a few days when the same ought to be in your possession. With regard to all other grave-sites it will take some little time after the applications have been made but eventually the complete list ought to be in your possession.

I am compiling this week a list of Burial Sites and will publish same in Daily Orders Part II, which will be a lasting document for reference at any time. It was only during my recent chat with Anderson that he showed me the importance that the Home Office places to this information in regard to the relatives of the deceased. I shall do my best to meet the demand.

It is known that we have as many as seven or eight men buried in the one grave and no doubt it can be arranged to secure a copy for each family....."

Application has been made to the proper quarter for photographs and further results will be reported.

This is perhaps more a matter for the N.W.C.A. to take up; in any case as in other not strictly official matters, results are at the disposal and co-ordination of that body, meanwhile the subject is being pursued so far as may be consistent with other pressing work in this office.

A certain amount of expense may be incurred in this connection, which, it is assumed, can be paid ex Public funds?

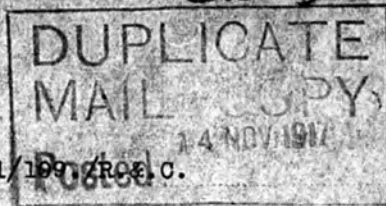



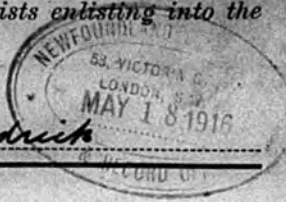

"Sir, Re Graves of Crosbie and Wheeler.

I write to ask if you will kindly inform the relatives of "the above named soldiers, now deceased, that the Grave Site of their "son has been put in splendid order during the past fortnight, also "that the flowers and foliage planted will stand the cold weather and "bloom again next year. There has also been placed on each of "these graves a nice artificial wreath of white roses with this "inscription "DERNIER DEVOIR", a token from some french society. "These are the only two of our brave fellows who have been buried in "this town and my only regret is that it is not possible for me to "visit other towns, such as Etretat, Havre, Boulogne, St. Pol, etc "so that all of their resting places might receive the same attention.

"The cemetery in which the two men in question are buried is "known by the name of St. Sever Cemetery, Rouen, and up to the present "it contains some 3000 British soldiers each of whom is allotted a separate grave site. Also, there is a small wooden cross at the head of each bearing the soldier's Regtl. No., Rank, Name, and the name of his Regiment."

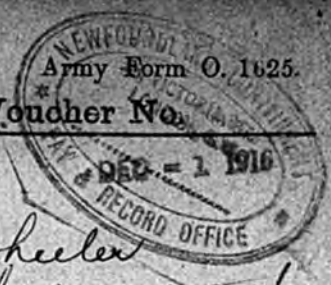

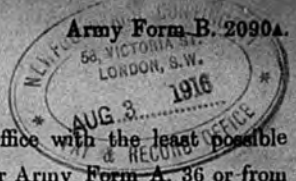
