Being one of these who have gone over and lucky enough to return home slightly wounded - several times I have been interested by writers to daily papers about giving soldiers land such as they are getting in Canada.

Now there is a piece of land suitable for farming mostly cattle and sheep raising north end Parsons Pond, Dist. St. Basile I understand this is on property "General Oilfields Limited" they are not working near this. Neither would it in any way interrupt their operations.

My father couple years ago files in Crown Lands Office application for a Grant. He has had no chance to get it surveyed or measured.

Would you kindly look into this, if it is not any inconvenience to your Department. See what could be done.

I have a notion of going there to try this land.

Should I have to pay the whole cost getting Grant well that will take cream off what capital I have.

I thank you in advance for this.
