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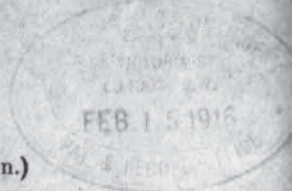

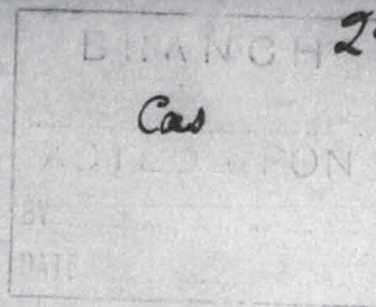

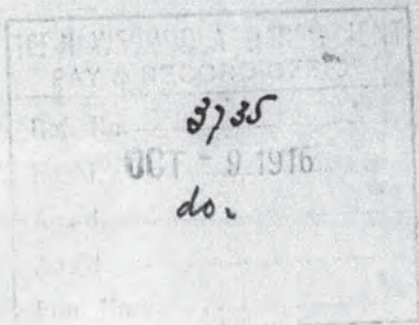

Sgt. Major White returned to this unit about 4½ months ago wearing the uniform of a 1st class Warrant officer. Enquiries were made from you as to what was his correct and substantive rank and a letter was ultimately received from Colonel Hadow saying that he left the 1st attn. as acting Regt. Sgt. Major but that it was intended to confirm him in that rank in orders.

The Meritorious Service Medal.

1030. (a) A recommendation for registration for The Meritorious Service Medal and annuity under the Pay Warrant, 1931, Article 1194, may be submitted by a C.O., subject to the following conditions :-

That the candidate -

- (i) has served 21 years with the colours (except in the case of invalids, who may be recommended if discharged after 18 years' service);
- (ii) has served in a regular unit in or above the rank of serjeant;
- (iii) is in the possession of the medal for long service and good conduct;
- (iv) has an exemplary character.

(b) The fulfilment of the above conditions does not, in itself, qualify a warrant officer or N.C.O. for recommendation by his C.O. Only those whose services are considered to be of exceptional and outstanding merit should be recommended, and it should be borne in mind that the automatic registration of candidates who possess the qualifications set out in sub-para. (a) would detract from the value of the medal.

(c) The following instructions will be followed in submitting recommendations for registration :-

- (i) Recommendations of soldiers discharged on or after 1st April 1934, will be in letter form, accompanied by certified copies of the conduct sheets and records of service on A.F.B. 200. They will be forwarded direct to the War Office by the O.C. the unit to which the candidate belongs or is attached.
- (ii) Applications for registration by soldiers discharged before 1st April, 1934, will be submitted either to the O.C. the last unit with which the candidate served, or to the officer i/c records, for his recommendation, and transmission to the War Office.
- (iii) In the case of registered candidates who are permitted to continue in the service after the completion of 21 years with the colours, a final copy of their record of service (A.F. B 200) will be forwarded direct to the War Office, within one month after the date of their discharge, by the O.C. the last unit in which the candidate served. This will contain an entry showing the character assessed.
- (iv) No covering letter is required to accompany such records of service, but the forms should be marked "Candidate for M.S. Medal" in red ink at the top.
- (v) Entries will be made by C.Os. on the A.Fs. B.268 of all discharged warrant officers or N.C.Os. above the rank of corporal showing whether they are qualified for registration for the award of the medal with annuity, and whether or not they are being recommended for the award.

(d) The possession of the medal and/or bars to the medal for gallant conduct or devotion to duty or meritorious service, awarded under the terms of Army Orders 352 and 400 of 1916 and 45 of 1917, does not qualify for the annuity; but a soldier above the rank of corporal holding the medal may be recommended for registration for the annuity if, and when, he fulfils the other conditions required for registration for the medal and annuity.
