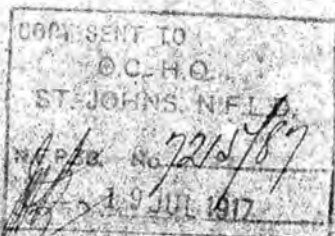

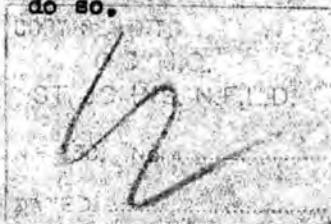

My dear Capt. Timewell,-

I am writing you a few lines to ask you, please do you know if there was any Ambulance men killed or missing in the first of July big battle. I would like to know as my son have been missing ever since, Private Frederick White, No. 1481.

I heard that a soldier that was wounded that same day say, that my son was in a shell hole and was wounded and the stretcher bearers came and took him away. I don't know if he made a mistake or not, it may be some one else. I can't see what become of him if his statement is true. If he had died on the stretchers he would be accounted for as well as all the rest. Of course you know if there is any Red Cross men missing, of course I know you men is trying to find out, and doing all you can to find out. Some of we mothers is seeing dark days in Newfoundland, while lots of more don't know there is a war on.

I have got another son that lost his right leg fighting at the Dardanelles, he being in Hospital over a year, and he wont be home this Winter. He have had a big fight for his life. I would like for you to go and see him if you had time, and he could tell you more than I can write. He is in the Royal Pavilion Hospital, Brighton, Pte. Edward White, No. 1084. He is my youngest son, his father and myself is getting up in years, we are all alone, no one but our two selves, and the home being sad and lonely ever since my two sons answered duty's call.

Please write and let me know if there was any Ambulance men missing that first of July drive, as I heard he was taken away by two stretcher bearers. I can't think my son is alive on British soil, or he would report himself before this time, as he used to write me often before he was missing, unless he may be in a French Hospital, and then I know he would try and write if he could if he had the use of his right arm.

Please excuse all my mistakes, as I am in such trouble about my sons. I hope you will have good news for me by the time you get this.

Madam,

With reference to your letter 8/11/16, I very much regret to have to tell you that there is no further news of your son, No. 1481, Pte. F. White, who, although from a purely official point of view still remains among the missing, must I fear be regarded as one of the many who have paid the extreme tribute in the great struggle.

Naturally many rumours get about, and although it is human nature to cling to hope, it would appear to be an instance which is entirely discounted by time. A number of such have occurred during this war and the Newfoundland Regiment has had a large proportion.

With regard to your other son, No. 1084, Pte. E. White, he is at present about sixty miles from here, and I am afraid that my duties do not give me time to do any visiting. Meanwhile I am assured by the Newfoundland War Contingent Association that some of their Visiting Committee frequently see him, and on mentioning the matter to the Association they decided to telegraph in order to reassure you and it is much regretted that similar news cannot be given you with regard to your other son.

I can quite appreciate your reference to dark days: but there may be some consolation in the fact that they are shared by many others.



If the Officer in Charge of the Hospital considers that the work is of an unimportant character and can be satisfactorily carried out locally he will obtain an estimate (in duplicate) of the cost from a local firm and submit it with the report to the Ministry of Pensions.

The Secretary of the Ministry of Pensions will issue instructions to the Commandant, Roehampton, if it is considered necessary that the pensioner should be re-admitted to Roehampton.

On the receipt of such instructions a **Railway Warrant for the journey** will be sent to the Pensioner by the Commandant, Queen Mary's Convalescent Auxiliary Hospital. In no other way can men be re-admitted to Roehampton.

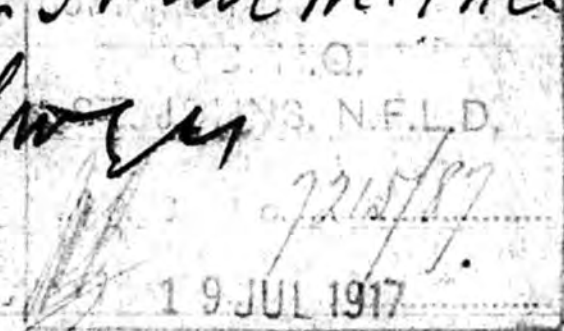

A full statement of his case was sent to the Director of Medical Services for the guidance of the Standing Medical Board with the request that the Board recommend his pension to be made payable from Aug. 24th, and a copy of the letter was sent to the Board of Pension Commissioners.

The Standing Medical Board made the recommendation as requested and it was understood that the matter would go through, and the man's discharge on demobilization was carried out in the ordinary way. Reference your communication of 3rd instant, it is noted that this man was reattested and was given leave to proceed home, which leave expired on July 9th.

As a soldier he has been absent without leave from this date and would in ordinary circumstances be dealt with accordingly.

It is evident that the man took it for granted that he would be discharged, when he wrote on the 24th of August, and that since that he has been going about his ordinary business as a civilian.

I would recommend that he be discharged from the 24th of August and a full statement of the case sent to the Officer i/c Records and also to the Secretary of the Board of Pension Commissioners to be dealt with by them.

The only other alternative would be to deal with the man as an absentee without leave from July 9th, which would have the effect of depriving him of both pay and pension, and which, as there appears to be a mis-understanding, would not be desirable. It should also be ascertained whether the man has an allotment current so that the department may be protected when discharge is effected.

At the next Standing Medical Board above noted man will appear to be medically examined previous to demobilization. For your guidance and subsequent action I detail herewith an account of his services to this date.

He was reattested on 29-10-17 and was attached to Depot and did continuous duty there up to 18-6-18, when he was granted leave which expired on 8-7-18. While on this leave, he found family affairs in such a state as necessitated his remaining at home to help them over the summer; he accordingly wrote to Major Garty (so he states) concerning his discharge, but received no reply. He then wrote to Officer Commanding Depot on 24-8-18 and made the same request and was ordered into Depot by telegram to have his discharge carried out in accordance with regulations. Through some misunderstanding, caused by his receiving the message over the 'phone at his home, he took it to mean he could report any time. We have no trace of him after that until he reported to Depot on 3-12-18.

His case has been referred to the District Officer Commanding and it has been suggested that he forfeit his Regimental pay from 24-8-18 as an absentee and his case be referred to the Board of Pension Commissioners. In this connection it is to be noted that unless his pension is made retroactive to that date he would lose both pension and pay, which would not be desirable, as the circumstances leading up to this state of affairs appears to be the result of a misunderstanding on his part. Would you, therefore, please place this case before the Standing Medical Board for their attention, so that when making their Disability Recommendation it may be from 24th August, 1918, if such is in order.

If I make him forfeit the full amount of his pay which has accrued during his absence can his pension be made payable retrospectively from the date of his being given leave? This man has lost a leg and it seems hard to deprive him of all his pay. On the other hand he should not be entitled to the pay whilst he has been absent so long from the Regiment.

He is now being discharged on Demobilization through the ordinary channels.
