Circumstances of Capture - The part of the trench I was in was blown in by the German hurricane bombardment with Trench Mortars and Minnenerfers. I was wounded in two places in the back, and knocked out. When I recovered the trench was full of Germans, and I was taken off to a Dressing Station behind their lines.

Details of life and treatment under capture - The same night I was sent to Le Catuan, where I was put in Hospital. I was here for over a month. The treatment was good on the whole, and they dressed me four times a week. Then I was sent to Dulman Camp for a week after which I was shifted to Hemmede for about two months to work on a farm. After a week there an Englishman and myself escaped through the window of the house and got away into the woods for four days before we were caught, They used dogs to track us and they caught us in a ploughed field, and fired shots at us. We were brought back to Bilcum under arrest, and the next day were sent to Dulman Camp again. We were given 7 days' imprisonment, and kept closely confined in a small cell. The only food we got was seven biscuits and a tin of Bully-beef, and water at the end of every four days. The next morning I was sent back to Hemmede to the same farm, but I refused to work with the same farmer, as we could not agree and were on bad terms. So they put me on another farm and watched me very closely, and at the beginning I always had two guards with me. I was in this Sector of the country right up till the Armistice was signed. I got my Red Cross Parcels and letters from home all right. Except for these parcels it would have been a problem how to keep alive, as the Germans nearly starved us. We were repatriated to England via Holland, and arrived in England in December,
