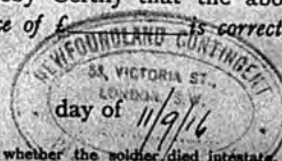

Dear Sir,

For some time past I have been ^{thinking} about the amount of money I received from the regiment since my discharge, and judging from what I hear from other discharged soldiers I don't really think I received all that was due me, so I decided that the best to do was to write you, and ask for a statement of my account, and if there is any money either "War Relief Grants" or "Clothing Allowance" due me. I would feel deeply grateful if you would forward same to me with the statement of my account.

I enlisted in St. John's, on April 28th 1915 and went overseas on June 20th 1915, after some months of training in Scotland. I contracted a stiff leg and was in hospital for four months undergoing medical treatment after my discharge from

hospital. I was boarded and considered no longer fit for service so in September 1916 I returned home to St. Johns and on the 31st of December 1916 I was honorably discharged. Since my discharge I received \$25⁰⁰ clothing allowance and sometime afterwards I received a cheque for one months War Service gratuity. but I believe that since the time of my discharge the clothing allowance has been increased to \$35⁰⁰ at least so that if there is any money due me after I should be ^{gratefully} obliged if you would have it sent onto me.
