Dear Sir.-

My boy Raymond, who was wounded in the Cambrai Drive last fall, and returned home in May last, in company with Captain Keegan, is still here with me and is now anxious to get some light work to do.

Some time ago, Dr. Blackall wrote him, saying he would get some light work for him around your Département, but just about that time your Dept. advised Dr. Barlow of this Port to examine Raymond and report on his condition, which he did, and gave him another six months to recuperate; however, he is now getting tired lying around here, and has grown a bit discontented, which I think is an indication that he is getting better, so I have thought, if you could work him in to some light job, you would greatly oblige me in these financial strained times.

Major George Carty promised Miss Taylor of the General Hospital, that he would place Raymond in some position, and I feel sure he would do something for me if he possible could.

If you would be good enough to order a Pass to be sent to Raymond, he could go along to St. John's, where your Employment Committee could see him.

NOTES.—(i.) 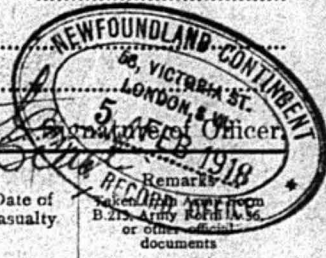
