Referring to my letter to you under date 26th October, I beg now to offer you my felicitations upon the fact that the news conveyed by the said letter and previously by telegram was incorrect. You will no doubt have been overjoyed to hear the good news and it was with the greatest pleasure that the Government received the same from the Record Officer, London. I now learn that the error occurred in this way. Private William Miller of Apsey Point, No. 107, was wounded and died of his wounds on the 17th October and it appears he was wearing the coat belonging to your boy. In this way the body was wrongly identified and this accounts for the news sent to us of the death of your boy.

Your gallant son, however, is still doing his duty and I am glad to think that the weight of sorrow has been lifted from your heart in respect of him. We have all great reason to be proud of our boys and they are receiving the highest commendation from all with whom they come in contact. From the Australians, who are fighting side by side with them, they are receiving the highest praise. I trust that your boy will come through unscathed and that in due time you may be again united.

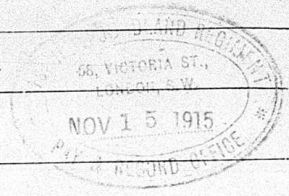
