## Cable Connection with all the World

All messages sent are subject to the following conditions :

A few days ago I forwarded by Registered Post a parcel of bulbs (one dozen assorted Hyacinths) as requested and trust that you will have good success with them. If you intend planting out of doors, bulbs should be set in the ground from six to nine inches and covered with manure. If for planting indoors in a box or flower pot bulbs to be set just deep enough to bring the tips to the surface of the earth, and in each case they will bloom in the early Spring.
