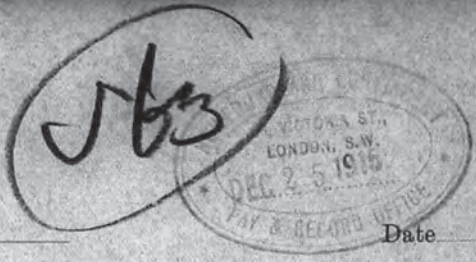



I have the honour to acquaint you that the Government have been giving consideration to the services rendered by Captain Gerald J. I, Capt. G.J. Whitty, O.B.E., M.C., of St. John's, Nfld., make oath and say as follows:-

I enlisted with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment at Badger on December 24th, 1914 and proceeded Overseas in the following April, embarking for Gallipoli on August 12th, 1915. After a period of service, during which I incurred Enteric Fever and severe groin strain, I was evacuated to Malta and later to England, where I arrived on December 1915. Here I had a severe relapse of Enteric Fever and after treatment was discharged with six week's leave on or about April 15th. I was then termed a Para-Typhoid carrier. Returning to the Depot at Ayr I engaged in light training but never felt sufficiently well to do full training. When drafts were urgently needed prior to and after July 1st 1916 I offered to take a place in the drafts but on all occasions was refused, being unfit. My condition improved somewhat, but about this time, my cough began to get worse in the mornings. I reported sick and was given cough mixture. This cough persisted from that time and has never left me to this day. Capt. J.E.J. Fox can vouch for the accuracy of this statement as I interviewed him on several occasions re drafts and he was familiar with my condition. I continued training with the Signal Corps and in April 1917 I returned from a course and proceeded Overseas (I may here state that I was subject to no medical examination as to my fitness, not did I ask for one) On July 25, 1917, while forming the rear guard to a party returning from wiring, I was blown into the Yser Canal, sustaining injuries to the eyes and a cut across the nose, as well as having everything detachable on me blown away. I rested in the line and resumed my duties two days afterwards. On November 21st, 1917, during the Cambrai show, I was blown up by a shell and while suffering considerable shock I remained for fifteen minutes when I received a G S W in the Right Shoulder penetrating below the shoulder blade. It was thought at the Casualty Clearing Station that same had penetrated my Lung and I was treated as such, but this, however, was not the case. I was invalided to England on December 1st after having an operation performed at Rouen. From the time I was blown up my nerves gave me considerable trouble and while in the Third London General Hospital I was treated for same. The Board who examined me took particular care to make an examination for shell shock and I was sent to the Hydro-Pathic, Moffatt, Scotland, for treatment and rest, where I remained for a considerable time, being eventually discharged at my own request after I had a Board, in which I intimated that I was physically fit and wanted to be discharged. I returned to Winchester, England, and did not go Overseas after that time although under orders on two occasions.

In June 1919 I had a minor operation performed at the 3rd L.G.H. and later joined the final draft from the Depot for Newfoundland. My health at that time was far from good. I was feeling weak and debilitated and had a considerable feeling of tightness in the chest with coughing and frequent expectorations.

On arrival at St. John's, I saw the Medical Doctor, Major Knight who prescribed for me on several occasions, the prescriptions being filled at Kennedy's Drug Store. I was placed on the retired list on July 29th, 1919. I took rest and went in the country for a time hoping that i would improve. On August 29th 1919 I went to New York where I had secured employment with the Eastern Union Co, Broad Street. On my arrival I was taken ill, and was in bed for two weeks. On the advice of a physician who attended I was advised to return to St. John's, until my health had recovered. I, however, did not, but went to Montreal where I though climatic conditions would be more suitable. There I secured employment as Station Agent with Canadian National Railways at Grand Mere. Que, but after two months I was forced to resign and after a fruitless search for light work I returned to St. John's, in November, about four months after discharge. After a further rest I went to work with my former employers, The Reid Newfoundland Co. Ltd., as Train Despatcher. (I had been working with this Company for six years prior to enlistment) After working for one month at this occupation I found that my nerves would not allow me permorming the duries allocated to me as Train Despatcher, my pre-war occupation. It was about this time that I wrote asking for a Board, same beinf granted. In view of my health I had to resign and later ~~xxxxxx~~ took up out door work with the C R E where I worked until I took up my present position. Prior to enlistment I enjoyed perfect health andw weighed 160 lbs., wheras to-day my weight is only 149 lbs.

I was discharged with a pension of 10%, same being dis-continued some time later. I have never felt that I should make strong representation for a pension, but in my present condition I am reluctantly forced to do so as I feel that I am unable to carry on with my ordinary avocations. I am at present employed on Secretarial work with the G W V A St. John's, and reside with my people at Waterford Bridge Rd.

I, Capt. G. J. Whitty, O.B.E., M.C., of St. John's, Nfld., make oath and say as follows:-

I enlisted with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment at Badger on December 24th, 1914 and proceeded Overseas in the following April, embarking for Gallipoli on August 12th 1915. After a period of service, during which I incurred Enteric Fever and severe groin strain, I was evacuated to Malta and later to England where I arrived on December 1915. Here I had a severe relapse of Enteric and after treatment was discharged with six week's leave on or about April 15th. I was then termed a Para-Typhoid carrier. Returning to the Depot at Ayr I engaged in light training but never felt sufficiently well to do full training. When drafts were urgently needed prior to and after July 1st 1916 I offered to take a place in the drafts but on all occasions was refused being unfit. My condition improved somewhat, but about this time my cough began to get worse in the mornings. I reported sick and was given cough mixture. This cough persisted from that time on and has never left me to this day. Capt. J. E. J. Fox can vouch for the accuracy of this statement as I interviewed him on several occasions re drafts and he was familiar with my condition. I continued training with the Signal Corps and in April 1917 I returned from a course and proceeded Overseas (I may here state that I was subject to no medical examination as to my fitness, nor did I ask for one.) On July 25th 1917 while forming the rear guard to a party returning from wiring I was blown into the Yser Canal, sustaining injuries to the eyes and a cut across the nose as well as having everything detachable on me blown away. I rested in the line and resumed my duties two days afterwards. On November 21st, 1917 during the Cambrai show I was blown up by a shell and while suffering considerable shock I remained for 15 minutes when I received a G.S.W. in the Right Shoulder penetrating below the shoulder blade. It was thought at the Casualty Clearing Station that same had penetrated my lung and I was treated as such but this however was not the case. I was invalided to England on December 1st after having an operation performed at Rouen. From the time I was blown up my nerves gave me considerable trouble and while in the Third London General Hospital I was treated for same. The Board who examined me took particular care to make an examination for shell shock and I was sent to the Hydro-Pathic, Moffatt, Scotland for treatment and rest where I remained for a considerable time being eventually discharged at my own request after I had a board in which I intimated that I was physically fit and wanted to be discharged. I returned to Winchester, England, and did not go Overseas after that time although under orders on two occasions.

In June 1919 I had a minor operation performed at the 3rd L.G.H. and later joined the final draft from the Depot for Newfoundland. My health at that time was far from good. I was feeling weak and debilitated and had a considerable feeling of tightness in the chest with cough and frequent expectorations.

At arrival at St. John's I saw the Medical Doctor, Major Knight who prescribed for me on several occasions, the prescriptions being filled by Kennedy's Drug Store. I was placed on the retired list on July 29th 1919. I took rest and went in the country for a time hoping that I would improve. On August 24th 1919 I went to New York where I had secured employment with the Eastern Union Co., Broad Street. On my arrival I was taken ill and was in bed for two weeks. On the advice of a physician who attended me I was advised to return to St. John's until my health had recovered. I however did not but went to Montreal where I thought climatic conditions would be more suitable. There I secured employment as Station Agent with the Canadian National Railways at Grand Mere, Que. but after two months I was forced to resign and after a fruitless search for light work I returned to St. John's in November about four months after discharge. After a further rest I went to work with my former employers-- The Reid Newfoundland Co. Ltd.--as Train Despatcher (I had been working with this Company for six years prior to enlistment. After working for ~~one~~ ^{one} month at this occupation I found that my nerves would not allow me performing the duties allocated to me as Train Despatcher--my pre-war occupation. It was about this time that I wrote asking for a Board, same being granted. In view of my health I had to resign and later too up out-door work with the C.R.E. where I worked until I took up my present position. Prior to my enlistment I enjoyed perfect health and weighed 160 lbs. whereas to-day my weight is only 149 lbs.

I was discharged with a pension of 10%, same being discontinued sometime later. I have never felt that I should make strong representations for a pension, but in my present condition I am reluctantly forced to do so as I feel that I am unable to carry on with my ordinary avocations. I am at present employed on Secretarial work with the G.W.V.A. St. John's and reside with my people at Waterford Bridge Road.

He was suffering from Bronchial Catarrh and had a good deal of expectoration.

On his return from France, whither he went between the times I first saw him on July 24th. and again on Aug. 13th. the chest condition had improved somewhat, but he is evidently very susceptible to attacks of Catarrh, - no doubt due to the result of service in France.

I would therefore, in view of this tendency to Bronchial Catarrh, recommend that his application for pension might be reviewed.
