Report of Medical Officer on case of No. 3328 Pte. Levi Williams, 1st. Nfld. Regiment, died at Windsor Feb. 15th. 1917.

- Feb. 12th. 1917. 3328 Pte. L. Williams reported sick in billets, visited him and found him suffering from general pains and cough (grippe).
- Feb. 13th. 1917. Visited Pte. Williams again. Condition about same.
- Feb. 14th. 1917. 8.30 a.m. Received message from Barracks stating that Pte. Williams was having a fit. Received another message a few minutes later saying he was quiet and better. Proceeded to visit patient and on arrival found him unconscious. Efforts to bring him to consciousness were unavailing.
- Had patient removed to observation ward and called in Dr. Bissett, who is the Canadian Military physician here. Owing to the serious condition of patient and it was decided to call in another physician ~~at~~ at 2.30 p.m. in consultation with Drs. Bissett and Keddy, a provisional diagnosis of meningitis was made with no hope of recovery.
- Visited patient at intervals during night. No change.
- Feb. 15th. 1917. Visited patient at intervals during morning; gradually weakening. Patient died one p.m.

Notification was made by Dr. Bissett to the A.D.M.S., M.D. No. 6 at Halifax and in view of the nature of diagnosis and condition of patient, a post ~~at~~ mortem was ordered and Capt. Nicholls, R.A.M.C., was sent FROM Halifax to perform same.

He reported that death was due to meningo^{ca}cephalitis of ^{the} influenza origin, and that there was no infection.

I have the honour to report for your information that I have this date performed an autopsy on the body of No. 5328, Pte. Levi Williams, Newfoundland Regiment, Overseas Draft, who died at Windsor, N.S., February 15th., 1917. My findings are as follows:-

Acute meningoencephalitis: acute splenitis: congested organs:
oedema of right lung: acute bronchitis: old healed peritonitis:
healed tuberculosis of the right lung.

There was nothing to indicate epidemic cerebrospinal meningitis, Bright's disease, or poisoning.

My opinion is that the brain condition was of influenzal origin.

The remains of deceased were interred this afternoon in Maplewood Cemetry with full military honours. Arch-Deacen Dr. Martell of the Church of England officiated. Through the kind offices of Dr. Martell the grave site is situated in a plot of ground which was bought for the soldiers who might die here. The full particulars of the site will be kept by Dr. Martell, who, I understand is writing to the Church of England clergyman at Pouch Cove and also to the relatives of the deceased. The Rev. gentleman was in attendance before Pte. Williams died, but deceased did not at any time regain conciousness.

You will have heard officially particulars regarding the death of your gallant young parishioner
No. 3828 Pte. Levi Williams,

You may assure his people that the brave lad had every attention. Major Paterson and two other Doctors did their best medically. The cause of death was that fatal paralysis of the nerve centres which we call cerebro-spinal-meningitis. We lost one soldier last year at Ayr and we have one poor lad hopelessly ill, I fear, at the General Hospital. The collapse in each case has followed Influenza.

Archdeacon Martell attended the death-bed and read the Burial Service. The grave site at Windsor has been acquired by the Newfoundland Government.

The Death Certificate is in the hands of the Deputy Paymaster in Charge of Records.

You may assure his sorrowing relatives that all things possible were done for their brave boy.

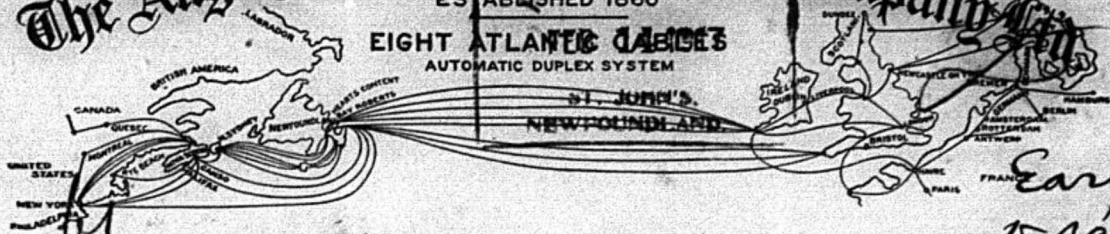



before Pte. Williams died, but deceased did not at any time

Williams, 1st. Bfld. Regiment, died at Windsor Feb. 15th. 1917.

- Feb. 12th. 1917. 3328 Pte. L. Williams reported sick in billets, visited him and found him suffering from general pains and cough (grippe).
- Feb. 13th. 1917. Visited Pte. Williams again. Condition about same.
- Feb. 14th. 1917. 8.30 a.m. Received message from Barracks stating that Pte. Williams was having a fit. Received another message a few minutes later saying he was quiet and better. Proceeded to visit patient and on arrival found him unconscious. Efforts to bring him to consciousness were unavailing.
- Had patient removed to observation ward and called in Dr. Bissett, who is the Canadian Military physician here. Owing to the serious condition of patient and it was decided to call in another physician ~~at~~ at 2.30 p.m. in consultation with Drs. Bissett and Keddy, a provisional diagnosis of meningitis was made with no hope of recovery.
- Visited patient at intervals during night. No change.
- Feb. 15th. 1917. Visited patient at intervals during morning; gradually weakening. Patient died one p.m.
- Notification was made by Dr. Bissett to the A.D.M.S., M.D. No. 6 at Halifax and in view of the nature of diagnosis and condition of patient, a post mortem was ordered and Capt. Nicholls, R.A.M.C., was sent FROM Halifax to perform same.
- He reported that death was due to meninge^{al} cephalitis of ~~influenzal~~ ^{influenzal} origin, and that there was no infection.
