With reference to my telegram of even date informing you that your son, No. 1647 Private Martin Williams, who had been previously reported Killed in Action, is now at Wandsworth Hospital, London, the following is a copy of the telegram received to-day from the Record Office, London.

" Previously reported by War Office Killed in

On the 20th instant a report was received at this office that your son had been admitted to the 1st Canadian General Hospital, Etaples on the 14th October. This was followed on the 27th October by a report that he had been Killed in Action on the 12th October. While this latter appeared to contradict the first report received, we could only suppose that being the latest information, it was correct.

To-day's telegram, however, proves that the report of his having been in hospital at Etaples was correct, and the fact of his having been removed to London shows that his wound was not of a serious nature.

While I appreciate that it is humanly impossible for even such a perfect Organization as the British War Office to handle without mistake the enormous amount of work they are called upon to perform during this war, I sincerely regret the unnecessary pain and grief which you must have suffered, and I hasten to congratulate you on the happy outcome of the unfortunate occurrence.

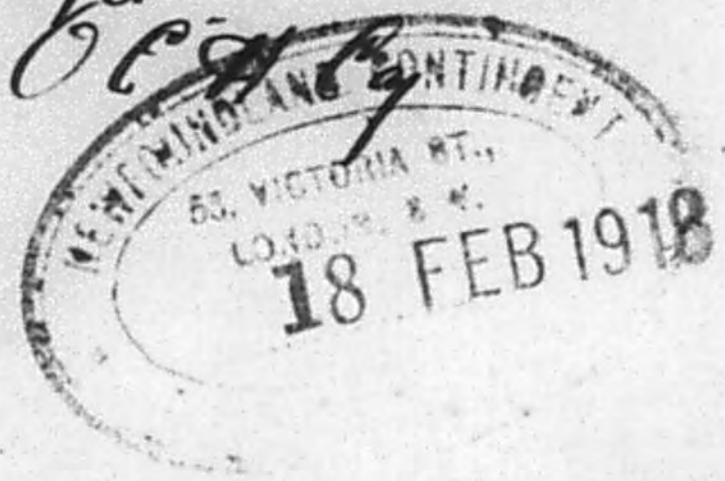

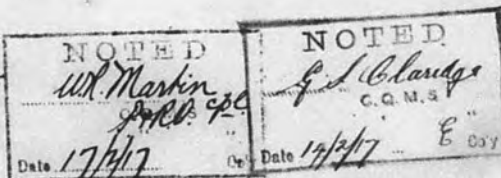

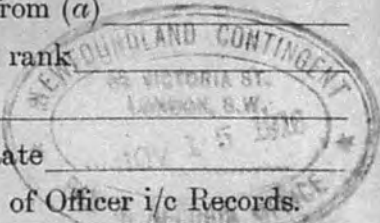
