"I have been waiting since 8 Dec/16 for some information concerning the location and photograph of the grave of my son No. 2185 Corporal Herbert Wills of the 1st Newfoundland Regt. who was killed in action on 8 Dec./16.

Capt. Rev. A. Clayton has, I believe, written about the matter but has been unable to get anything definite, although we have many times seen, in the newspapers, of numbers of graves and localities being given to people. There was also a notice recently that photographs of graves were only supplied to relatives of the

deceased soldier.

Trusting that you will at your earliest convenience give me all the information mem you have concerhing my boy's burial place."

London, teporting that your son, Exivate Herbert Wills, was killed in action on December 8th.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, sincerest sympathy in your time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the Heart is heavy with its loss, yet it is a glorious thing to think that your gallant boy early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble boys but no less do we esteem the unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their boys when the call of duty came. Though your boy has laid down the earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name is inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow countrymen. When the end of this war comes and Peace once more reigns upon earth, it will be your proud thought that your dear boy did, to the utmost of his ability, to bring about such result.


