It is understood that Pte. Wilson is acquainted with the facts revealed by your minute, as he has already approached me with a view to obtain furlough.

In view of the number of applications already made for furlough to Newfoundland for various ^{different} reasons, and the discontent caused to those whose applications could not be entertained, it was decided some months back to discontinue the grant of furlough for any reason whatsoever.

A return to this practice will immediately result in a large crop of applications from soldiers and their dependents.

For this reason I am averse to granting furlough to Pte. Wilson unless the Minister of Militia specially desires it.



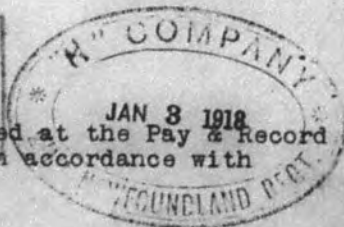
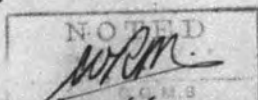
