L.11, 9/12/16, and are also notmentitled to subsistence allowance of \$2.00 per day, granted to Officers on sick leave, see D. P. letter No. 193, 28/12/17.

This rule was applied in the case of Major J. W. March, who was granted special leave during the period; and also dapt. Nangle, C. F. attached to the 1st. Bn. who was granted leave to proceed to Newfoundland. In his case, pending your ruling, passage was paid provisionally, but has since been debited to his account. He continued to receive Mess allowance as an Imperial Officer attached, during the period of his leave, as in the case f Major J. W. March.

I return letter from Mr. H.D. Windeler to Your Excellency dated September 14th. with reference to his son, Temp. Major H.S. Windeler.

This Officer was promoted to Gaptain on April 20th. 1916. He was detached for special duty with a Machine Gun Company, and promoted to be temp. Major, as noted in the London Gazette of January 17th. 1917. The particulars of this promotion are noted in the Newfoundland Royal Gazette of date February 6th. In this Gazette was also noted a copy of letter from Brigadier General Inglis.

Mr. Windeler is therefore in error in stating that official publication of this promotion has not yet appeared.

It might be pointed out to Mr. Windeler that his son is an Officer in the Newfoundland Regiment and promotion in same can only take place as vanancies occur in the establishment.

While Major Windeler performed good service, the fact must not be lest sight of that other Officers in the Regiment have also performed gallant and meritorious services, and that substantive premotion can only take place in regular turn.

There are still in the Newfoundland Regiment Officers who left here with the first five hundred, and who, though senior to Major Windeler, only hold the rank of Captain in the Regiment, now in the firing line.

Major Windeler's special work has received recognition in that he has been promoted to a temp. Majority, and this fact has been officially recognised.

It would be unfair, however, to those Officers who have performed equally meritorious service, and who were among the original Officers to leave here, to recommend any special substantive premotion in the case of temp. Major Windeler.

The appointment of an Officer to temporary rank is brought about by the exigencies of the service, and the special duties he is called upon to perform, but he is liable at any time, to revert to his substantive rank when called upon to rejoin his own unit.

You might instance the case of Forbes Robertson who, though only a Captain in his own Regiment, was appointed

temp. Majer and second in Command of the Newfoundland Regiment, and in Lt. Colonel Hadew's absence was appointed to Command the Regiment with the rank of temp. Lt. Colonel. While acting in this capacity he led the Regiment at the Battle of Monchy with great credit and earned the D.S.O. When, however, Lt. Col. Hadew returned temp. Lt. Col. Forbes Rebertson reverted to hes original position as second in Command and memp. Major.

An example such as this would undoubtedly serve to show Mr. Windeler the position which his sen is now occupying, and that no injustice is being done to him. For a young man to have gone so far in, in itself, meritorious.

Your Excellency: -

It is with much pleasure I learn of your appointment to the Governorship of New South Wales, and beg to tender to Lady Davidson and yourself my sincere congratulation, at the same time offering an assurance of my deep regret that at the call of duty to the Empire you are obliged to leave us.

Lady Davidson has been very kind to my daughter Cecil, and Your Excellency has always been cordial and frank to me and furthermore, you have shown an interest in my son Harry.

As you are aware my son's Majority dates from January Ist 1917. He is 0.C the 93rd Machine Gun Co'y, and at the taking of Beaumont Hamel in November 1916, his work met with the approval of Brigadier General Inglis, who sent him a personal letter, which I had the pleasure of showing to Your Excellency.

Though still attached to the NF Regt the Official announcement of his having attained his Majority in that Regiment has not yet appeared, and consequently were he incapacitated from further active service he would simply rank as Captain and the Imperial recognition be lost to him.

The lad has had no bolstering. By acting like a man in the face of the enemy, the Imperial Military Authorities have twice promoted him, first to a Captaincy, then to his Majority, and I would ask Your Excellency if this honorable recognition of his work by such high Authority, does not entitle him to rank Major in the NF Regiment?

This is a matter I would ask Your Excellency to look into, and if possible adjust before bidding us good bye.

I would impress upon Your Excellency the fact, that, as regards this enquiry, I am acting entirely upon my own initiative. My son knows nothing whatever of my intentions in this respect, but I cannot reconcile present conditions with the knowledge, that he joined the NF Regiment with a 3 years course at the Royal Military College, Kingston Ont, (graduating as Lieutenant) to his credit; that by ability he has worked his way up, and in the opinion of the Imperial Military Authorities has made good.
