

Dear Sir:-

In answer to your letter of Dec. 9th which was enclosed with scroll and the message from His Majesty the King as it brings sorrow into the heart yet the message from His Majesty and the scroll makes me glad to be the father of a brave boy who gave up his life for King and Country. Sir my memory fail to collect words to describe how dear these emblems are to me and of being a British subject and to receive a message from His Majesty the King, Sir, if any word is to be sent to His Majesty the King will you be so kind as to send the same for me as I am no qualified to do so and Sir, I received the Star but there is a mistake in the letters, it is E.Winsor whereas it should be G.Winsor. You will have to forgive me for being so late in answering as I am here on this desolate island, and the first mail for three months. Both the number and the letter E is wrong on the Star the number is 472 and my dear boy's number is 1845 I have sent it home to see if any person has the wrong one. With best wishes to you and God save the King and give him a long life.

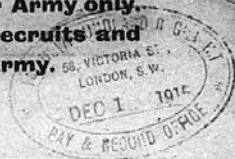

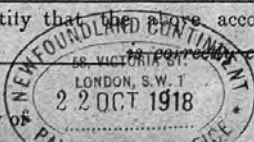


