Dear Sir,

I have been instructor by the Government to forward you one S.M.D. E. Rifle, as an appreciation by the Government of the voluntary services rendered by you as a Musketry Instructor of Recruits. It was the wish of the Government that this rifle should be presented publicly and they thought on several occasions to arrange a suitable time. Unfortunately that was not practicable and in accordance with the request of W. H. Rennie the Government have now ordered me to send this rifle privately to you and the other Musketry Instructors.

As far as I am aware this rifle is as good as any in the Quartermaster's Stores. However, there are about a dozen others there and if there are any parts which you would like to get changed or if you would like to change this rifle for any other in the hands of the Quartermaster

I shall be glad if you will call at the Quartermaster's Department, H. J. Stabb and Company's premises and choose another according to your fancy. It would be an easy matter to transfer the silver plate from this rifle to another.
