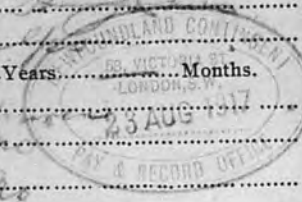

Dear Madam,

I beg to inform you that I communicated by cable on the 4th instant with Major Timewell, of the Newfoundland Pay and Record Office, London, drawing to his attention the fact of your having received a cablegram from your son No. 1628, Private William F. Wiseman from Scotland, he having last been reported on Active Service in France. In his reply, which I have to-day received, Major Timewell states that your son was, on the 16th August, transferred, with several other men of the Regiment, from the British Expeditionary Force to the Second Battalion in Scotland, classed permanent base. This of course means that owing to the injury to his foot which he has sustained, he has been declared as unfit for further active service at the front. This will explain the receipt by you of the telegram which you produced at this office.
