

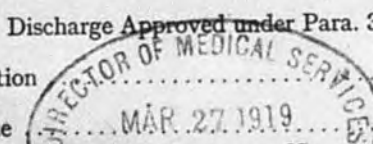



With reference to your letter of July 26th replying to my complaint of a previous date I beg to state that the mistake which at first seemed rather puzzling to me now appears self evident.

First of all you have addressed me as S.M. Young; my initials are S.P.

This of course may be a typographical error but there are ~~others~~ in the regiment by the name of Young. Again this seems to bear out your statement that you paid to me personally on June 7th one installment of my War Service Gratuity (Seventy dollars). You are apparently confusing me with some one else because I have not been to town since the date of my discharge April 14th, neither did I receive any payment whatever from you in June. If you look up your returned vouchers you will only find two checks

of \$70⁰⁰ each endorsed by me. If somebody
has been practicing embezzlement on you
it is not for me to pay the penalty of losing
